

Here's What We're Learning

Homophones are words that sound the same but have different meanings and spellings. Examples: **night** (dark time) and **knight** (brave warrior). Even though they sound identical, each one means something completely different!

Word Cards

Read each homophone. Notice how each sounds the same as another word but means something different.

the dark time when you sleep

We went to bed at night.

knight

a brave warrior

The knight rode his horse.

sea

a large body of salt water

We swam in the sea.

see

to look with your eyes

I can see the birds.

sun

the hot star in the sky

The sun is warm.

son

a boy child

She loves her son.

flower

a pretty plant that blooms

She picked a flower.

flour

powder for baking

Mix the flour with water.

bear

a large furry animal

We saw a bear in the forest.

bare

naked or empty

His arms were bare in summer.

hair

what grows on your head

She brushed her hair.

hare

a fast animal like a rabbit

The hare ran quickly.

Prefix Examples

- Homophones = words that sound the same but mean different things

Grammar: Sentence Punctuation
