

Here's What We're Learning

Homophones are words that sound the same but have different meanings and spellings. Examples: **night** (dark time) and **knight** (brave warrior). Even though they sound identical, each one means something completely different!

Remember This!

night = the dark time when you sleep knight = a brave warrior sea = a large body of salt water see = to look with your eyes sun = the hot star in the sky son = a boy child flower = a pretty plant flour = powder for baking bear = a large furry animal bare = naked or empty hair = what grows on your head hare = a fast animal like a rabbit Tip: Think about the meaning to pick the right homophone!

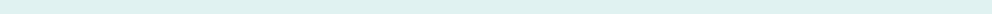
