Synonym Tips:

1. Synonyms have the **same or similar meaning**.
2. **beautiful** = lovely — both describe something pleasant to see
3. **enormous** = huge — both describe something very large
4. **friendly** = kind — both describe someone pleasant
5. **quickly** = fast — both describe speed
6. **amazing** = incredible — both describe something surprising
7. **delicious** = tasty — both describe good flavor
8. **grateful** = thankful — both describe appreciation
9. **powerful** = strong — both describe great strength
10. **wonderful** = fantastic — both describe something excellent
11. **carefully** = cautiously — both describe being careful
12. **brilliant** = bright — both describe shining light

Remember: using synonyms makes your writing more interesting!
